3. ELECTION DAY

If you choose to vote on Election Day, August 28th, you must go to your home precinct's polling place to do so. On Election Day, the polls are open from 7:00 am - 7:00 pm.

To find your polling place, look at your voter information card, or go to VoteWalton.com to lookup your info.

Before voting:

- · Be sure your voter registration information is up-to-date.
- If voting at the polls, be sure to bring proper photo and signature identification. Get the list at VoteWalton.com.
- If voting by mail, be sure your signature in your voter record is up-to-date.

NO NONPARTISAN BALLOT

There are no universal or nonpartisan contests on the ballot this time. Therefore, only registered Democrats and Republicans will be voting in this election. Voters registered with no party affiliation or with minor parties will not be voting in this election.

What is a Primary Election?

A Primary Election is an election held preceding the General Election for the purpose of nominating a party nominee to be voted for in the General Election to fill a national, state, county, or district office. Party nominees from the Primary Election I go on to face opposition from minor party I candidates, candidates with no party affiliation, and/or qualified write-in candidates in the General Election.

Florida is a CLOSED **Primary Election state** What does this mean?

Only voters who are registered members of a political party may vote for that party's candidates in a primary election, unless the race is a Universal Primary Contest, meaning all candidates are running with the same party affiliation and there is no opposition in the General Election. (However, there are no I Universal Primary Contests in this election.) I Nonpartisan contests, such as judges and school board, are voted on by all voters in a Primary Election. (However, there are no nonpartisan contests in this election.)

Registration and Party Change Deadline

Voters are issued the ballot that corresponds with their party affiliation in their voter registration record. The deadline for a voter to register to vote or make a party affiliation change in their registration record for the Primary Election is

July 30, 2018.
